FAQ's

• Creating a New Namespace

In order to create a new workspace one first has to create a page in the workspace : namespace :pege

• Deleting a Namespace

When all pages inside a namespace are removed see <u>delete a page</u>)the namespace logically doesn't exist anymore. DokuWiki usually deletes the now empty directory as well.

• Renaming a Namespace

In Dokuwiki terminology, renaming a namespace is classified as a move. Use the Move Plugin. To use it navigate to the page (or page in a namespace) you want to change, then open the Admin menu and select the Move plugin from the list of additional plugins.

In the box, click on the radio button **Move namespace** which will show the existing name of the namespace you want to rename.

In the **New Name** field, enter the new name for the namespace. If you are moving the namespace into another namespace as well, enter the namespace path.

Here is a good picture and for more information see the Usage Section of the Move plugin and the Technical Details of the Plugin Move.

Is there a way to selectively include things in a TOC?**

Yes. Configuration settings exist to control which heading levels should appear in the TOC. Go to the Admin page, then to Configuration Settings, and then to the Display. There you will find settings that can be set for TOC. Take note, that the field names for configuring the TOC are also hyperlinks with more information.Click here to go to the Wiki42d Admin Display section.
